Instructions for submitting course request forms for 2024-2025 school year

#### **General Information**

Please read this before filling out your course request form:

- The <u>Master Schedule</u> is posted on the Resources page of the Mount Academy website. This should help you visualize the different paths through the school day. You will want to refer to the Master Schedule when filling out your Course Selection Worksheet.
- The <u>Course Descriptions</u> booklet is also posted on the Resources page. This includes details about each class, for example, required vs elective, full year vs one semester, prerequisites, etc.

## Information for 11th Grade

- A music or art class is required for all students. You may choose one of the following:
  - Art History (Semesters 1 and 2)
  - Choir (full year)
  - Concert Band (full year)
  - Drawing & Painting (Semesters 1 and 2)
  - General Music (full year)
  - Orchestra (full year)
  - Theater Arts (Semesters 1 and 2)

### • Other required classes:

Note that you won't necessarily be in the period you select on your form.

- Chemistry or Advanced Chemistry
- English 11 or Advanced English 11
- Math (specific class as recommended by your current math teacher)
- US History or Advanced US History
- Physical Education (this class does not appear on the Master Schedule or any forms; we will schedule it for you so as to best accommodate your other course requests.)

- Language class. A third year is recommended but not required. You may choose one of the following:
  - German III
  - Spanish III

Electives are only taught if there is sufficient interest from students.

- Environmental Science (Semester 1 only)
- Graphics Lab (Semesters 1 and 2)
- Great Books (Semesters 1 and 2)
- Journalism (Semesters 1 and 2)
- Layout and Design (Semesters 1 and 2)
- Machining (Semesters 1 and 2; double period)
- Metal Fabrication (Semesters 1 and 2; double period)
- Meteorology (Semesters 1 and 2)
- Music Theory (full year; alternating days)
- SAT/ACT Prep (Semester 2 only)
- Technical Drawing (Semesters 1 and 2)
- Videography (Semesters 1 and 2)
- Videography (Semesters 1 and 2)
- Welding (Semesters 1 and 2; double period)
- Wind Ensemble (full year; alternating days)\*

\*To participate in Chamber Choir, Wind Ensemble, or Chamber Orchestra you must also be enrolled in Choir, Concert Band, or Orchestra.

#### **Instructions**

Forms must be submitted by April 12, 2024

- To fill out your Course Selection Worksheet:
  - 1. Print a blank Course Selection Worksheet.
  - 2. Fill out the worksheet based on the Master Schedule and the information above.
- To submit the online course request form:
  - 1. We recommend using a desktop computer rather than a mobile device.
  - 2. Sign in to the PowerSchool Parent Portal;
  - 3. Click on Forms on the left navigation bar;
  - 4. Click on 11<sup>th</sup> Grade Course Request Form 2024-2025
  - 5. Fill out the form based on your Course Selection Worksheet;
  - 6. Click Submit.

#### Notes

- A reminder that you are submitting course *requests*. Enrollment in any course is at the discretion of the Principal.
- In the next few weeks we'll send the co-curricular (afterschool) request form, which includes athletic teams, clubs, and vocational offerings.
